An Act to Limit to 4 the Number of Consecutive Terms a Legislator May Serve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §§21-A and 41-A are enacted to read: 4 §21-A. Senators; term limits 6 A member of the Senate may not serve more than 8 consecutive 8 years. If a member is elected to fill a vacancy in office, the time served during that period is not included in the 8-year limit. A member who has served 8 years is not eligible to serve 10 a partial term. A member who is serving a legislative term on 12 the effective date of this section is entitled to complete the term and the term is not included in the 8-year limit. 14 Representatives; term limits \$41-A. 16 A member of the House of Representatives may not serve more than 8 consecutive years. If a member is elected to fill a 18 vacancy in office, the time served during that period is not 20 included in the 8-year limit. A member who has served 8 years is not eligible to serve a partial term. A member who is serving a 22 legislative term on the effective date of this section is entitled to complete the term and the term is not included in the 24 8-year limit. 26 STATEMENT OF FACT 28 .30 This bill limits the terms that a Senator and a member of the House of Representatives may serve to 4 consecutive terms. This bill limits the terms that a Senator and a member of the House of Representatives may serve to 4 consecutive terms. A Senator or a member of the House of Representatives who reaches the limit may serve additional terms in the opposite house.
