- A. Ten percent of the balance must be deposited in the Maine State Parks Capital Improvements Fund established in section 610;
- B. Twenty-six percent of the balance must be deposited in the Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund established in section 7757;

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- Fund registration plates beginning April 1, 1994 in accordance 2 . with this section. Environmental registration plates are not required for registration of a motor vehicle but are to allow citizens to participate voluntarily in the Maine Environmental Trust Fund program. A citizen may apply for environmental registration plates and contribute to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund as provided in this section.
- 1. Issuance of environmental registration plates. The Secretary of State, upon receiving an application and evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 36, the registration fee required by this Title and the contribution to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund provided for in subsection 4, shall issue a registration certificate and a set of environmental 14 . registration plates to be used in lieu of regular registration The Secretary of State may issue environmental plates. registration plates to a vehicle in any registration class if the designated registration plate for that class does not preclude its use in conjunction with the environmental registration plate design.
- 22 2. Plate design; optional environmental vanity plates. Secretary of State, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in 24 consultation with the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters shall determine 26 the plate design.
 - The design must accommodate the use of numbers and letters as provided in section 192. Upon request and as provided by section 192, the Secretary of State shall issue environmental plates that are also vanity plates. Environmental vanity plates are issued in accordance with this section and section 192. The annual service fee of \$15 for vanity plates is credited to the Highway Fund.
 - 3. Temporary facsimile plate. The Secretary of State may issue a facsimile plate for temporary use up to a 60-day period until the permanent plate is received. The facsimile plate must be attached to the rear plate bracket.
- 4. Contribution to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund. In 42 addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee prescribed by law for the particular class of vehicle registered, the annual 44 contribution for environmental registration plates is \$20 which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited to the 46 Maine Environmental Trust Fund established in section 7759.
- 5. Reimbursement for production and issuance costs. The 50 Treasurer of State shall transfer annually from the Maine Environmental Trust Fund to the Secretary of State \$5 for each set of environmental plates issued or renewed after March 31, 52

1996. This transfer is to reimburse the Secretary of State for costs associated with production and issuance of the plates.

Reimbursement for production and issuance costs; first 2
years of program. The Treasurer of State shall transfer annually
from the Maine Environmental Trust Fund to the Secretary of State
\$10 for each set of environmental registration plates issued or
renewed during the period April 1, 1994 to March 31, 1996. This
transfer is to reimburse the Secretary of State for costs
associated with production and issuance of the plates.

Sec. 5. Report. The Secretary of State shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by January 15, 1996 on the issuance of environmental registration plates during the period April 1, 1994 to December 31, 1995. The report must include the number of applications received for environmental plates, the number of plates issued, the number of environmental vanity plates issued, the production and administrative costs of the program and an accounting of revenues generated for the Highway Fund and the Maine Environmental Trust Fund. The report may include recommendations to the committee on ways to improve the program's operation, to maximize revenues from the program and any steps needed to ensure that all reasonable production and administration costs incurred by the Division of Motor Vehicles are reimbursed.

Sec. 6. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

The Secretary of State, Division of Motor Vehicles, will require additional Highway Fund allocations of \$357,788 and \$104,685 in fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95, respectively, to manufacture and issue approximately 54,000 pairs of environmental plates for fiscal year 1993-94 and 13,500 for fiscal year 1994-95. These Highway Fund costs will be reimbursed by transfers to the Highway Fund from the Maine Environmental Trust Fund in the amount of \$10 per set of plates during the first 2 years of the program, and \$5 per set during the succeeding The remaining environmental license contribution is retained by the Maine Environmental Trust Fund and allocated to specific programs. This plate program will increase net revenues to the Highway Fund and increase dedicated revenues to the Maine The estimated increases of Highway Environmental Trust Fund. Fund revenues are \$540,000 and \$675,000 in fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95, respectively. The estimated increases of dedicated revenues to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund are \$540,000 and \$675,000 in fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95, respectively.

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to administer the new Maine Environmental Trust Fund and dedicated programs. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is the minority report. It replaces the original bill. This bill establishes the Maine Environmental Trust Fund registration plate program. The program will provide funds to:

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1. The Maine Environmental Trust Fund established by this bill. This fund will award grants to nonprofit land conservation organizations, including land trust and local governments, for purchase of land and easements for valuable habitats and open space;

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2. The Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund to protect and maintain endangered and nongame wildlife. Current funding for this program comes from the "chickadee checkoff" found on income tax forms;

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3. The Natural Areas Conservation Fund for conservation of rare plants and natural communities; and

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4. The Maine State Parks Capital Improvements Fund established in this bill to fund improvements at existing state parks and historic sites.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H to S.P. 222, L.D. 693

Funds for the Maine Environmental Trust Fund registration plate program come from a contribution of \$20 for a set of special environmental registration license plates. This annual contribution is paid in addition to the annual registration fee. The plate design will be different from the lobster registration plate and will have an image representing the importance of the State's natural resources. The Secretary of State will be reimbursed annually for costs incurred in producing, issuing and renewing the special plate, in the amount of \$10 per set of plates during the first 2 years of the program and \$5 per set during the succeeding years.
