An Act to Establish the Maine Environmental Trust Fund Commemorative Motor Vehicle Plate.

Submitted by the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to Joint Rule 24. Reference to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources suggested and ordered printed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7757, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 526, §2, is amended to read:

1. Establishment. There is established the Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund. It-shall-receive The fund receives money deposited by the Treasurer of State pursuant to Title 36, section 5284 and Title 38, section 359. All money deposited in the fund, and the earnings thereon on that money, shall-remain remains in the fund to be used for the management of nongame wildlife and for necessary administrative and personnel costs associated therewith with the management of nongame wildlife, and shall may not be deposited in the General Fund or any other fund, except as specifically provided by statute law.

Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §252-J is enacted to read:

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<u>§252-J. Maine Environmental Trust Fund plates</u>

The Secretary of State shall issue Maine Environmental Trust Fund commemorative registration plates to enhance the State's environment and public awareness of the State's valuable natural resources. These commemorative plates are not required for registration of any motor vehicle but are solely for purposes of allowing citizens who wish to voluntarily participate in this program to make contributions to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund as provided in this section.

30 1. Plate design. The Secretary of State, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the Commissioner of Inland 32 Fisheries and Wildlife shall determine jointly the plate design. These plates must bear letters or letters and numbers not 34 exceeding 7 characters. There may be no duplication of identification, except that the Secretary of State may issue 36 duplicate plates for camp trailers if the registrant has already been issued an identical plate for a passenger vehicle.

 2. Plate use. Plates may be used on passenger motor
 40 vehicles, including, but not limited to, station wagons, taxicabs, limousines, pick-up trucks, motorcycles, motor homes
 42 and camp trailers. These plates may be used in lieu of other numeric-type registration plates.

3. Plate fee. The plates must be issued upon application and payment of an annual voluntary contribution to the Maine Environmental Trust Fund of \$25. The contribution must be in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee as prescribed by law for the particular vehicle. The fee must be deposited with the Treasurer of State to the credit of the Maine

Provides for reimbursement to the Secretary of State for costs incurred in producing and issuing plates, grants to the Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund, grants to nonprofit organizations and funds to market the environmental commemorative plate program.

STATEMENT OF FACT

20 This bill establishes the Maine Environmental Trust Fund commemorative license plate program. The program will provide 22 funds to:

24 1. The Maine Environmental Trust Fund established by this will bill. This fund award grants to local nonprofit 26 organizations, including land trusts and local governments, for purchase of land and easements for valuable habitat and open 28 space; and

 The Maine Endangered and Nongame Wildlife Fund established by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7757
 to protect and maintain endangered and nongame wildlife. Current funding for this program comes from the "Chickadee Check-off"
 found on income tax forms. Funds received from the check-off are not sufficient for the goals of the program.

Funds for the Maine Environmental Trust Fund commemorative
license plate program come from a voluntary contribution of \$25
for a special environmental commemorative license plate. This
contribution is paid in addition to the annual registration fee.
The plate design will be different from the lobster plate and
will have an image representing the importance of the State's natural resources. The Secretary of State will be reimbursed for
costs incurred in producing and issuing the special plate.
