An Act to Amend the Mars Hill Utility District.

(EMERGENCY)

Reference to the Committee on Utilities suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Representative KNEELAND of Easton. Cosponsored by Representative: MacBRIDE of Presque Isle, Senator: LUDWIG of Aroostook.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, unless this legislation is enacted as an emergency measure, planned spring construction by the Mars Hill Utility District may be jeopardized; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. P&SL 1957, c. 143, §1 is amended to read:

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Sec. 1. Territorial limits; corporate name and purpose. The inhabitants and territory within the town of Mars Hill and the inhabitants and territory within a certain tract or area, containing 800 acres, more or less, of the town of Blaine, bounded and described as follows: the block or area of land bounded northerly by the town line between the town of Blaine and the town of Mars Hill; easterly by the center line of the Prestile Stream; southerly by the center line of the Pierce Road and an extension westerly to the Bubar Road to a point 2,000 feet westerly of U. S. Route 1, as measured along the Bubar Road; and westerly by a line 2,000 feet westerly of and parallel to U. S. Route 1, in the county of Aroostook shall-be-and-hereby, are constituted a body politic and corporate under the name of the "Mars Hill Utility District," for the purpose of supplying the tewn-of-Mars-Hill district and the inhabitants of said-tewn the district with pure water for domestic, commercial, sanitary and municipal purposes, including the extinguishment of fires, and of supplying the town-of-Mars-Hill district and the inhabitants of said-town the district with suitable and adequate sewerage and sewage treatment and disposal facilities, as hereinafter provided.

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Sec. 2. P&SL 1957, c. 143, §2, first ¶ is amended to read:

Sec. 2. Powers. Said The Mars Hill Utility District is hereby authorized for the purpose aforesaid to take, collect, store, flow, use, detain, distribute and convey to the tewn-ef Mars-Hill district or any part thereof of the district water from any lake, pond, stream or river or from any surface or underground brook, spring or vein of water in tewn or near said tewn the district in the United States or Canada, and is also authorized to locate, construct and maintain aqueducts, pipes, conduits, standpipes, hydrants, pumping stations and necessary

2	structures and equipment therefore, and do anything necessary to furnish water, sewerage, drainage and sewer treatment and disposal for public purposes and public health, comfort and convenience of the inhabitants of towns.

8	Sec. 13. Property; tax exempt. The property of said the Mars
10	Hill Utility District shall-be is exempt from all taxation in the tewn towns of Mars Hill, Blaine and Westfield.
12	Sec. 4. Approval; Town of Blaine. At a special town meeting
14	held July 27, 1992 the Town of Blaine approved expansion of the boundaries of the Mars Hill Utility District to include a portion of the Town of Blaine.
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	Sec. 5. Approval; Town of Mars Hill. The town council of Mars

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	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
