COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 242, L.D. 735, Bill, "An Act to Prohibit Businesses from Requiring Social Security Numbers in Certain Cases"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Prohibit the Display of Social Security Numbers on Credit Cards, Customer Service Cards and Debit Cards'

Further amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "§1272." (page 1, lines 29 to 34 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

§1272. Prohibition

A business operating in this State may not display a social security number on a credit card, customer service card or debit card issued or distributed by that business on or after January 1, 1994.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

This bill establishes a new civil violation. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenues by a minor amount.

The Department of the Attorney General and the Bureau of Consumer Credit Protection will incur some minor additional costs to enforce this new violation. These costs can be absorbed within the existing budgeted resources for these 2 agencies.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment deletes the provision that prohibits businesses from asking or requiring social security numbers. It prohibits the display of a social security number on a credit card, customer service card or debit card issued or distributed on or after January 1, 1994. The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
