1. A person is guilty of escape if, without official permission, he the person intentionally leaves official custody, er intentionally fails to return to official custody following temporary leave granted for a specific purpose or a limited period or intentionally goes to a location other than that permitted by the terms of the leave.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

It is not clear under current law that a person who is on furlough is guilty of escape if that person intentionally goes to a location other than that allowed by the terms of the furlough. This bill specifies that such behavior constitutes "escape" under the law.
