An Act to Enhance Voters' Rights in Budget Approval of School Districts.

(EMERGENCY)

Presented by Senator TITCOMB of Cumberland. Cosponsored by Senators: O'DEA of Penobscot, VOSE of Washington, Representatives: BRUNO of Raymond, KUTASI of Bridgton, PLOURDE of Biddeford. **Emergency preamble. Whereas**, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, under current law, a school administrative district budget that has been rejected by the voters goes into effect unless a subsequent budget is proposed and passed prior to July lst; and

10 Whereas, the voters do not have the expertise to create an alternative proposal, thus limiting their input in the budget 12 process; and

14 Whereas, this bill provides for an incentive to the school board and school management to propose an alternative that is
16 likely to more closely resemble a compromise solution; and

18 Whereas, it is necessary that this legislation take effect prior to July 1st, the deadline for approval of school 20 administrative district budgets; and

22 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 24 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 26 safety; now, therefore,

28 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

30 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1308, as amended by PL 1991, c. 429, §3, is further amended to read:

§1308. Failure to pass budget

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If a budget for the operating of the district is not approved prior to July 1st, the budget as submitted-by the beard 36 ef--directors approved by the voters for the prior year is automatically considered the budget approved for operational 38 expenses for the ensuing year or until a budget is approved by 40 the voters pursuant to section 15617, subsection 2, paragraph D. In districts with line-item budgets, only those line items 42 rejected by the voters are funded at the prior year's amount. All other lines are funded in the amounts approved by the voters, 44 except that, when the school board delays the school budget meeting in accordance with section 15617, subsection 2, paragraph 46 C, the operating budget must be approved within 30 days of the date the commissioner notifies the school board of the amount allocated to the school unit under section 15613 or the budget 48 submitted-by-the-directors approved by the voters for the prior year becomes the operating budget for the next school year. 50

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Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §15617, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:

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D. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, in school administrative units where the school budget is rejected by the voters, a special budget meeting, called in accordance with section 15618, subsection 2, paragraphs A to C may consider another budget offered by the school board. If accepted by the voters, the budget becomes the operating budget for the next school year.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

18 Under current law, a school administrative district budget that has been rejected by the voters goes into effect unless a 20 subsequent budget is proposed and passed prior to July 1st, or if the school board delays the budget meeting pursuant to the Maine 22 Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15617. This bill provides for an incentive to the school board and school management to 24 propose an alternative budget that is likely to more closely resemble a compromise solution than automatically adopting the 26 new budget that has been rejected by the voters.

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
