SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 262, L.D. 800, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Credentialing of School Psychological Service Providers"

Amend the amendment in subsection 3 in the 5th line (page 1, line 25 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "board" the following: 'and the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The Division of Special Education within the Department of Education will incur some additional costs for the meeting expenses of the Advisory Committee on School Psychological Service Providers. These costs can be absorbed within the division's existing budgeted resources.

The Board of Examiners of Psychologists can absorb any costs related to establishing certification requirements for school psychological service providers within existing budgeted resources.'

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This amendment also replaces the fiscal note.


