- 2. Licensure by commissioner. The Commissioner of Education shall license school psychological service providers pursuant to rules adopted by the State Board of Education. The rules must include a code of ethics and practice standards for school psychological service providers, violation of which constitutes grounds for suspension or revocation of the license.
- 3. Qualifications. State Board of Education rules governing the qualifications for a school psychological service provider license must require that a license be issued only to an applicant who has met the academic and preprofessional requirements established by the State Board of Education for the provision of school psychological services and who, at a minimum:
  - A. Holds a graduate degree from an accredited program in school psychology that was approved by the National Association of School Psychologists/National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education or the American Psychological Association in School Psychology at the time the degree was awarded;
  - B. Has completed graduate work that is determined by the Commissioner of Education to be substantially similar to the programs referred to in paragraph A; or
  - C. Holds a valid license from the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists with demonstrated competency in the area of school psychology as established by the State Board of Education.
- 4. Term of issuance. The Commissioner of Education shall issue a school psychological service provider license for a term of years consistent with rules adopted by the State Board of Education. The length of the term may vary among license holders so as to be coterminous with any other professional license or certificate held by the school psychological service provider.

  The school psychological service provider license may be renewed in accordance with academic and professional requirements established by the State Board of Education.
  - 5. Exclusive regulatory authority. The provisions of chapter 56 do not apply to persons licensed as school psychological service providers under this section except to the
