An Act to Amend the Charter of the Lewiston-Auburn Water Pollution Control Authority.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1967, c. 92, §6 is amended to read:

Sec. 6. Inspection, rules and regulations. The authority shall prevent, insefar as much as practicable, the discharge into the 6 sewers of substances which might damage the sewage treatment facilities or interfere with their maintenance and operation, 8 pass through to the receiving waters, or endanger the health and 10 safety of any authority employee. Its The authority's officers and agents shall have free access to all premises served by the 12 sewage treatment facilities at reasonable times in order to inspect the sewers, drains, sewage pumping stations, tanks or 14 treatment works, and determine the amount and character of sewage, drainage or other wastes flowing therefrom from the 16 sewers, drains, sewage pumping stations, tanks or treatment works and whether such sewage, drainage or other wastes are do, or are likely to, damage or impair the sewage treatment facilities ΘF_{\perp} 18 interfere with their maintenance and operation, pass through to 20 the receiving waters or endanger the health and safety of any authority employee.

The authority may, for the proper operation of its the 24 sewage treatment facilities, issue administrative orders, rules and regulations which shall-be are binding on the Auburn Sewerage 26 District and the City of Lewiston and the inhabitants of each, as to the quantity and character of any sewage, drainage or other 28 waste distribution into any sewer connected with said the plant. These orders, rules and regulations may incorporate industrial 30 pretreatment requirements including, without limitation, reporting, monitoring and other requirements imposed on the authority by federal or state law or regulations or requirements 32 adopted by the authority, and the authority may require 34 industrial pretreatment of wastes discharged into the sewage treatment facilities or into any system connecting with the 36 sewage treatment facilities.

 40 Sec. 7-A. Permits. The authority may, through its rules and regulations, issue permits or other control mechanisms to
42 individual users of the sewage treatment facilities, for the purposes of controlling the amount and character of the wastes
44 discharged into the sewage treatment plant, and for other requirements imposed on the authority by federal or state law,

Sec. 14. Lewiston-Auburn Water Pollution Control Board. The authority shall-be is under the management and direction of a 2 shall---be <u>is</u> board of directors, which known as the Lewiston-Auburn Water Pollution Control Board, also referred to 4 herein as "the board" or "the board of the authority." The board shall--eensist <u>consists</u> of 7 members. The director of the 6 Lewiston Department of Public Works, the City Administrator of the City of Lewiston, the superintendent and the president of the 8 Auburn Sewerage District and the Manager of the City of Auburn shall-be are members of the board by virtue of their respective 10 offices and in the event of the termination of their respective offices they continue as members of the board of the authority 12 until their replacements are elected or appointed. Reasonable notice of the date of the meeting and of the necessity of electing a new member of the board of the authority, who may be the <u>an</u> incumbent, shall <u>must</u> be given to the mayor of Lewiston by the secretary or clerk of the authority.

At the initial meeting for organization of the authority, or 42 as soon thereafter after the initial meeting as practicable, the 6 above-named members of the board shall elect a 7th member who 44 shall must be a resident of Auburn or Lewiston but shall may not hold any public municipal office or be a member of any municipal 46 board or committee. If the 6 members are unable to agree upon the naming of a 7th member of the board, any Justice of the 48 Superior Court or Supreme Judicial Court, shall, on petition of any 4 of the members, select the 7th member of the board. The 50 7th member of the board shall-serve serves for a 3-year term and

thereafter until his the member's successor is appointed, and may be elected to serve an additional 3-year term of office. When a vacancy occurs in the position of the 7th member of the board, a replacement shall must be elected by the remaining members of the board to serve for the remainder of the term in the same manner as initial elections are held. The members of the board shall serve without compensation, but shall-be are reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, on approval of the board.

Sec. 4. P&SL 1967, c. 92, \$15, as amended by P&SL 1979, c. 70, \$2, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Sec. 15. Election of officers. The board shall appoint and 14 determine the compensation of a superintendent who is the administrative officer. The board has the power to remove the 16 superintendent at the board's pleasure. The superintendent must 18 be an individual meeting the requirements for the operator in charge of a wastewater treatment plant under the Maine Revised 20 Statutes, Title 32, chapter 62, except that an uncertified person or unregistered professional engineer who is nevertheless 22 eligible for certification or registration as a professional engineer may be appointed as acting superintendent and serve for a period of up to one year. In the board's discretion, the board 24 may reappoint the acting superintendent for additional one-year 26 terms.

28 The board may appoint, and may at the board's pleasure remove, a treasurer and clerk who are not members of the board, 30 and both offices, if the board determines it advisable, may be held by the same person. The treasurer shall furnish the board with a bond payable to the authority issued by a surety company 32 authorized to transact business in the State and satisfactory to 34 the board as surety, in such sum as the board may prescribe and conditioned on the faithful performance of the treasurer's 36 duties. The duties of the treasurer and clerk are those usually appertaining to those offices, respectively, and in addition such 38 duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the board. The compensation of the treasurer and of the clerk is determined by 40 the board. The superintendent, with the approval of the board, shall from time to time appoint or employ such engineers and such 42 experts, agents, officers, clerks and other employees as the superintendent determines necessary, and shall determine their 44 duties. The salaries or compensation of all persons appointed or employed under this section, together with other expenses, are paid by the authority and are considered a part of the expense of 46 operation of the authority. 48

Sec. 5. P&SL 1969, c. 92, §17 is enacted to read:

Page 3-LR0849(1) L.D. 801 Sec. 17. Injury to property of the authority or interference with the operation of the authority. Any person who places, discharges, spills, leaks or leaves any offensive or injurious matter or material on or in the conduits, catch basins or receptacles of or served by the authority contrary to the authority's regulations is liable to pay twice the amount of damages to the authority, to be recovered in any proper action.

Any person who knowingly injures any conduit, pipe, 10 reservoir, flush tank, catch basin, manhole, outlet, engine, pump or other property held, owned or used by the authority is guilty 12 of a Class E crime.

14 Any industrial user of the authority, as defined by the authority, that violates any order, rule or regulation of the 16 authority, or violates any state or federal law, order, rule or regulation pertaining to the requirements of the authority's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Permit, including the 18 authority's pretreatment program, is enjoined from continuing in 20 any such violation and may be assessed, in addition to any other civil or criminal penalties provided by federal or state law, 22 administrative penalties imposed by the authority of not more than \$1,000 a day for each violation. The authority may make 24 provision for assessment and collection of the administrative penalties as well as procedures for the notification to 26 industrial users of the penalties and enforcement of the administrative penalties in its rules and regulations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Charter of the Lewiston-Auburn Water Pollution Control Authority to:

 Conform the charter to federal law regarding the
implementation and enforcement of the Industrial Pretreatment Program;

2. Conform the charter to state law regarding the specified 40 qualifications of the treatment plant superintendent; and
