SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 615, L.D. 830, Bill, "An Act  
Amending the Charter of the Brewer Water District"

Amend the bill in section 2 in section 14-A in lines 6 and 7  
(page 1, lines 44 and 45 in L.D.) by striking out the following:  
"boating, fishing or swimming," and inserting in its place the  
following: 'boating or fishing.'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in section 14-A in the  
3rd line from the end (page 1, line 47 in L.D.) by inserting  
before the last sentence the following: 'Those bylaws may also  
restrict swimming to prevent pollution and preserve the purity of  
the water but any such restriction may not be more stringent than  
the 3,000-foot ban contained in section 14-B and must be  
consistent with the general laws of the State.'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in section 14-B in the  
first line (page 2, line 2 in L.D.) by striking out the  
following: "swim"

Further amend the bill in section 2 in section 14-B in the  
5th line (page 2, line 6 in L.D.) by inserting after the  
following: "District." the following: 'A person may not engage  
in or attempt to engage in swimming in or upon the waters of  
Hatcase Pond within 3,000 feet of the intake of the Brewer Water  
District.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment removes the restriction that prohibits all  
swimming in Hatcase Pond. Under the amendment, swimming is only  
banned within 3,000 feet from the intake of the Brewer Water

2 District. The amendment also clarifies that the Brewer Water  
3 District may not adopt bylaws that are more strict than the  
4 3,000-foot swimming limitation, which will allow the Brewer Water  
5 District to prescribe penalties for violations of this limitation.
