Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13007, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 591, Pt. I, §5, is amended to read:

б Fees. The commissioner shall assess fees for initial 1. teacher, education specialist and administrator certificates and for the renewal of inactive provisional and professional teacher, 8 education specialist and administrator certificates. The fee is 10 \$50 for the initial certification process for those teachers and education specialists found eligible and those found ineligible. 12 A renewal fee of \$50 must be assessed for each inactive teacher and education specialist. The fee is \$100 for the initial 14 certification process for those administrators found eligible and those found ineligible. A renewal fee of \$100 must be assessed inactive 16 for each administrator. Notwithstanding this subsection, there is no fee for adult education teachers.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under current law, the certification fees for adult education teachers are the same as regular full-time teachers.
The purpose of this bill is to reconcile the difference in earnings between regular full-time teachers and adult education teachers by eliminating the fee for the certification of adult education teachers.
