Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §122, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 307,
4 §1, is repealed.

6 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §122, sub-§4-A is enacted to read:

8 4-A. Prohibited one week before election. The registrar
10 may not register an applicant as a voter unless the application
12 is received by the registrar not later than 7 calendar days
14 before election day.

16 Sec. 3. 21-A MRSA §122, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 307,
18 §1, is amended to read:

20 5. **Alternative registration schedule for absentee voters.**
22 The registrar shall accept registrations under section 152 at any
24 time, ~~including election day~~ not later than 7 calendar days
26 before election day, provided that the applicant otherwise
28 qualifies as an absentee voter. The receipt of a completed
absentee ballot application by the clerk establishes a
presumption of qualification under this subsection.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill eliminates the provision that allows voters to register on election day and allows the registrar to register voters not later than one week before election day.
