COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 643, L.D. 874, Bill, "An Act to Protect Police Officers from Armor-piercing Ammunition"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "**\$1056**." in subsection 1 in the last line (page 1 line 11 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "ammunition" the following: '<u>other</u> <u>than as part of a bona fide collection</u>'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

This bill penalty increases the for possession of armor-piercing ammunition from a Class D to a Class C crime. 28 Sentences of more than 9 months for Class C crimes must be served 30 in a state correctional institution. The cost to the State per sentence is \$42,050 based upon an average length of stay of one 32 year and 9 months. The State also must reimburse counties for sentences served in county jails of 9 months or less for this 34 crime pursuant to the Communities Corrections Act.

36 The Judicial Department will require additional General Fund appropriations for an increase in indigent defense costs. The 38 amounts can not be determined at this time.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The amendment excepts a person who is otherwise guilty of 44 possession of armor-piercing ammunition from violation if the person possesses the ammunition as part of a bona fide collection. 46

Department of Corrections prepared the following The correctional impact statement on the original bill pursuant to 2 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-A, section 1402: "An Act to Protect Police Officers from Armor-piercing Ammunition would 4 increase the penalty for possession of armor-piercing ammunition from a Class D offense to a Class C felony. A sentence imposed 6 of more than 9 months for a Class C crime must be served in a 8 state correctional institution. The cost to the State per sentence is \$42,050, based on an average length of stay of one 10 year and 9 months. The State also pays the cost for sentences served in county jails of 9 months or less." 12

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
