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16	The purpose of this chapter is to encourage and maintain coordinated community efforts <u>in each county</u> to prevent child abuse and neglect and to ensure adequate intervention and

Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §3872-A is enacted to read:

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<u>§3872-A. Child abuse and neglect council's responsibilities</u>

**1. Duties.** A child abuse and neglect council shall assess and monitor the extent and causes of child abuse and neglect in its county and carry out the following activities.

A. Coordinate services, utilizing community, state and federal resources to ensure that direct services are being provided to children and families.

B. Provide training to professionals who deal directly with children and families.

<u>C. Provide education and awareness concerning child abuse and neglect and its prevention.</u>

Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §§3873 and 3874, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 483, are amended to read:

28 §3873. Authorization for expenditure of funds

30 The Commissioner-of-Human-Services-may department and other state agencies shall, from funds authorized to the department and 32 state agencies, make grants to incorporated---community coordinating-committees the child abuse and neglect councils or 34 fiscal agents to further the purposes of this chapter.

I. Grants. Grants shall <u>must</u> be made on a competitive basis according to rules adopted or amended by the commissioner.
Grants in excess of \$15,000 shall <u>must</u> be made on a one-to-one matching basis with contributions from the community. Community
contributions may be donations of cash or may be <u>in-kind</u> <u>in-kind</u> contributions, as determined by departmental rule.

2. Distribution of grants. Grants shall <u>must</u> be awarded to 44 support existing community-coordinating-committees <u>child abuse</u> and neglect <u>councils</u> and to assist the establishment of new 46 community--coordinating--committees <u>child abuse</u> and <u>neglect</u> <u>councils</u>. It is the intent of this chapter to support a 48 statewide network of community-coordinating-committees by-the-end ef-fiscal-year--1987 child abuse and neglect councils in each county.

Consultation with Maine Association of Child Abuse and 4 3. Neglect Councils. The Maine Association of Child Abuse and Neglect Councils shall advise the department regarding б the distribution of grants before any grants are awarded. The Maine Association of Child Abuse and Neglect Councils, in 8 conjunction with the department, shall develop a plan establishing a statewide strategy for child abuse and neglect 10 prevention in local counties and communities. This plan must be implemented at least one month before January 1, 1994 and updated 12 annually. Grants must be awarded in accordance with the goals 14 and strategies set out in the plan.

16 §3874. Fiscal agents

18 A fiscal agent receiving grants under this chapter shall act only in an administrative capacity to receive and distribute 20 grant money to the community-coordinating-committee <u>child abuse</u> and neglect councils, as described in the rules promulgated 22 <u>adopted</u> by the department for regulating the local administration of these programs.

Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §3875, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 483, is repealed.

28 Sec. 6. 22 MRSA §3875-A is enacted to read:

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## <u>§3875-A. Child abuse and neglect councils; membership</u>

32 The child abuse and neglect councils are responsible for governing the community programs under this chapter. Each 34 council shall establish a governing board of directors. The board must be diverse with broad-based participation in each 36 county. Terms of the directors and methods of appointment or election of members must be determined by the child abuse and 38 neglect council's bylaws.

40 Sec. 7. 22 MRSA §3876, as enacted to read by PL 1985, c. 483, is repealed.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

46 This bill makes the following changes to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 1057 regarding the prevention of 48 child abuse and neglect.

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1. The bill establishes the child abuse and neglect councils, formerly known as community coordinating committees.

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2. The bill recognizes the existence of and need for a child abuse and neglect council in every county.

This bill requires the Department of Human Services in
coordination with the Maine Association of Child Abuse and
Neglect Councils to develop a child abuse and neglect prevention
plan.

4. The bill clarifies the duties of the Maine Association of Child Abuse and Neglect Councils and of each council within a community.

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
