Be i	it	enacted	by	the	People	of	the	State	of	Maine	as	follows	:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3760-G is enacted to read:

§3760-G. Seasonal energy supplement

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In recognition of the inability of low-income families with children to meet the increased burden of purchasing energy, the department shall provide all aid to families with dependent children assistance units with a supplemental energy payment to offset in whole or in part the costs associated with seasonal variations in energy costs, except, however, this supplement is not available to persons living in room and board facilities, maternity homes, boarding homes or temporary shelters. This supplemental payment must be made to eligible families for the seasonal period consisting of the months of November to April of each year. For reasons of administrative simplicity, and in recognition that most aid to families with dependent children families utilize annual budget plans or other methods of extended payment, this payment must be provided in equal monthly amounts throughout the seasonal period. For the seasonal period beginning in November 1993, the energy supplement for each eligible assistance unit is \$20 per month. For subsequent years the monthly supplement must be adjusted by the estimated percentage increase, if any, for the average cost of purchasing energy in the next seasonal period.

Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Stripper Well Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
