	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §1, sub-§24 is enacted to read:
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c	24. Articulated bus. "Articulated bus" means a bus
б	<u>consisting of 2 passenger-carrying sections in which the rear</u> body section is flexibly but permanently connected to the front
8	<u>section in a manner that allows the vehicle to bend without having an interior barrier to movement between sections of the se</u>
10	vehicle.
12	Sec.2. 29 MRSA §244, sub-§4, $\P F$ is enacted to read:
14	F. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this subsection,
	<u>articulated buses may be operated or caused to be operated</u>
16	as long as the following conditions are met:
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18	(1) The total length of the vehicle does not exceed 61 feet, excluding bumpers;

	(2) The rearmost axle of the vehicle is self-steering;
