SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 682, L.D. 924, Bill, "An Act to Amend the School Funding Formula"

Amend the amendment in section 8 by inserting before that part designated "EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF" the following:

EDUCATION, STATE BOARD OF

State Board of Education (\$58,375)

Provides for the deappropriation of funds previously appropriated for the Task Force on Learning Results.

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

4 General Fund \$169,000

6 The method for the distribution of a hardship fund for
8 school administrative units is provided in this bill. The cost
10 to implement this proposal is \$7,205,332. Since Committee
12 Amendment "A" to the supplemental budget bill (LD 1761) provides
\$4,000,000 for this purpose, a General Fund appropriation for the
remaining \$3,205,332 for General Purpose Aid for Local Schools is
required.

14 This bill also includes a General Fund appropriation of
16 \$58,375 in fiscal year 1994-95 for the Legislature for the
Committee to Study Organizational and Tax Issues in Public
18 Schools for the per diem and expenses of members, to contract
with professionals and for miscellaneous committee expenses. A
20 deappropriation from the State Board of Education of \$58,375 in
fiscal year 1994-95 provides an offsetting source of funds so
22 that there is no net increase in General Fund costs. The
additional costs to provide staffing assistance to the committee
24 can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted
resources.

26 The Department of Education, the State Board of Education,
28 the Department of the Attorney General and the State Planning
Office will incur some minor additional costs to provide
30 assistance to the committee. These costs can be absorbed within
the various departments' and agencies' existing budgeted
resources.

32 The bill additionally includes a General Fund appropriation
34 of \$50,000 in fiscal year 1994-95 for the Legislature to contract
with the University of Maine System for educational research. A
36 deappropriation from General Purpose Aid for Local Schools in the
same amount will result in no net increase in General Fund
38 appropriations.

40 The bill provides a General Fund appropriation of \$169,000
42 in fiscal year 1993-94 to the Department of Education, Preschool
Handicapped program for federally mandated services to preschool
44 handicapped children. This appropriation will be offset by the
lapsing of \$169,000 from school construction aid audit recoveries
46 from the General Purpose Aid for Local School account, again
resulting in no net General Fund costs.

48 Authorization is provided to the Department of Education to
use up to \$170,000 of any additional available construction aid
50 audit recoveries or other unobligated balances in the General

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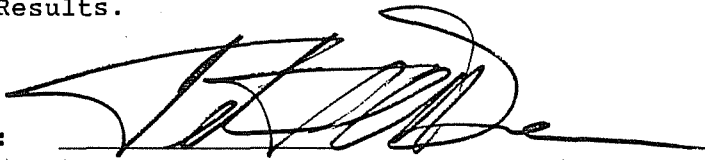

Purpose Aid for Local Schools program in fiscal year 1993-94 to
provide for additional needs at the Governor Baxter School for
the Deaf and for additional services for preschool handicapped
children. If these funds are available for use in these other
programs, the amount available to be carried forward into fiscal
year 1994-95 in the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program
will be reduced.'
