	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §602, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161,
4	§6, is amended to read:
6	6. Size. The Secretary of State shall determine the size of the ballots. <u>With the permission of the Secretary of State</u> ,
8	the clerk may make a reasonable number of enlarged ballots in order to assist voters who are visually impaired.

12	Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §603, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:
14	2. When furnished. The Secretary of State shall send a reasonable number of specimen ballots to the clerk for posting,
16	as provided in section 625, and an additional number with the regular ballots. <u>With the additional number sent, the Secretary</u>
18	<u>of State shall also send a reasonable number of enlarged specimen</u> <u>ballots for the visually impaired to be placed in the voting</u>

40	This bill amends the law to accommodate voters with visual
42	impairments. Enlarged ballots are permitted, a voting booth for the visually impaired at each voting place is required and confidentiality of reading assistance offered upon request.
