STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment eliminates the requirement that a person hold a state shellfish harvesting 6 license in order to obtain a municipal commercial shellfish license. The amendment does not alter the provisions of the 8 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 6601 that require a 10 person to hold a valid state shellfish license in order to harvest shellfish. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
