	§595. Municipalities authorized to create special property tax
10	districts
12	1. Special property tax districts authorized. A municipality that has geographically isolated islands may
14	establish a special property tax district or districts for those islands, or any one of them, by a vote of the municipality's
16	legislative body and may also establish a lower property tax rate to be applied to the assessed property within the district than
18	the rate that is applied to mainland property. For the purposes
20	of this section, "geographically isolated" means not connected to the mainland in a manner that allows motor vehicular access by
22	bridge.
	2. Time of voting. The vote establishing or dissolving a
24	special property tax district must be taken at least 60 days before the beginning of the municipal fiscal year in which it is
26	to go into effect.
28	3. Tax rate. The tax rate established for property within the district must be set on a percentage basis and must be at
30	least 50% of the rate established for all other property within
32	the municipality. Once established, the rate remains in effect unless altered by a vote of the municipality's legislative body
34	taken at least 60 days before the beginning of the municipal fiscal year in which it is to go into effect.

38	STATEMENT OF FACT
40	Several municipalities have islands that are not connected
42	to the mainland. Providing municipal services to these islands is often expensive and difficult and as a result the services
44	actually provided are often less than those received on the mainland. This bill allows a municipality's legislative body to
	create a special property tax district for islands and set a
46	lower property tax rate to recognize the lower level of municipal services.
