Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA $\S122$, first \P , as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, $\S6$, is amended to read:

A person may register as a voter by appearing before the registrar, proving that he that person is qualified under section 111, subsections 1 to 3, and filing an application provided by the registrar containing the information required by section 171. Township residents may register as provided in section 156. Any person registering to vote less than 6 weeks before an election must present that person's social security card for identification purposes in addition to any other requirements under this chapter.

- Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §122, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 307, §1, is amended to read:
- 4. Election day registration. The registrar shall accept registrations of applicants who appear in person on election day, except that, the applicant must present to the registrar a social security card as identification. The registrar shall issue to each of these applicants a certificate entitling the applicant to be placed on the voting list at the voting place. Only one certificate may be issued to any person.
 - Sec. 3. 21-A MRSA §130, as amended by PL 1989, c. 694, §1, is further amended to read:

§130. Applications for voter registration

A person who completes an application for registration to vote, as provided in section 152, may mail the application or have the application delivered to the registrar before the closed period for the acceptance of registrations in the person's municipality, to be placed on the voting list prior to the next election; except that applications completed under section 122, subsection 5, may be delivered during the closed period for immediate placement on the voting list. Any person who mails or delivers an application for registration to vote less than 6 weeks before an election must present a social security card as identification at the polls.
