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education in the unorganized territory of \$404,000 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$418,000 in fiscal year 1994-95. The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$10,000 in fiscal year 1993-94. General Fund revenues collected through the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund would increase by \$414,000 in fiscal year 1993-94 and \$418,000 in fiscal year 1994-95 to offset these additional expenses. The additional General Fund appropriations included in this bill and the resulting additional General Fund revenues are contingent upon the approval by the voters of the Town of Greenfield.

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The transfer of educational expenditures to the unorganized territory will result in savings of approximately \$200,000 in each of fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95 to general purpose aid for local schools. Tree growth tax reimbursement will also realize some minor savings. The Governor's proposed current services budget includes changes which may affect this bill's impact on general purpose aid for local schools and tree growth tax reimbursement. This estimate of the fiscal impact may need to be adjusted based on final legislative actions on the current services budget.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The bill deorganizes the Town of Greenfield. This amendment clarifies the bill in several ways.

The bill requires the Town of Greenfield to hold a special election following enactment of this bill for the purposes of securing final approval of deorganization by the voters of the town. That election would require additional local expenditures and could be termed a "mandate" under the Maine Constitution, Article IX, Section 21 which would require 90% state funding. The amendment adds a preamble to the bill authorizing passage of the bill without state funding if enacted by a 2/3-vote of the

38 membership of both bodies.

The amendment corrects the reference to the school unit from which Greenfield is withdrawing and inserts language withdrawing the town from Secondary Applied Technology Region 4.

The amendment directs the State Tax Assessor to assess real and personal property by April 1, 1993, adds an appropriation and a fiscal note to the bill.
