	§3763. Authorization of demonstration program; purpose

	To assist families in achieving economic independence by
12	providing additional economic incentives for custodial parents to
	work and enhanced child support collection services, the
14	department is authorized to establish the Child Assistance
16	Demonstration Program, known and cited in this chapter as the "child assistance program," in accordance with the provisions of
10	this chapter, in Penobscot County and 2 other counties to be
18	selected by the department. The department is further authorized
	to prepare an application to seek the required federal waives
20	approval under of the United States Social Security Act, Section
	1115; to submit that application to the joint standing committee
22	of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources
24	matters for review and approval; to submit the approved
24	application to the federal Department of Health and Human Services for waiver approval; and to implement the program

 Limits on reduction in payments. Limit decreases in the
basic child assistance payment provided under the child

public assistance owed to the State by parents participating in
the child assistance program:
6. No work hour restrictions. Impose no restrictions on
the number of hours that adults in a participating family may
work, as long as the family otherwise remains eligible for
assistance under this chapter;
7. Resource accumulation. Permit a participating family to
accumulate savings and other resources of up to \$10,000 without
penalty as long as the family otherwise remains eligible for
assistance under this chapter;
8. Alternative food stamp benefits. Provide food stamp
benefits in the form of equivalent cash rather than food stamp
coupons;
9. Medicaid eligibility. Continue Medicaid eligibility for
participating families and establish a method to provide up to 2
<u>years of transitional Medicaid benefits for families losing</u>
eligibility because of increased earnings; and
10. Child care. Guarantee work-related child care to all
participating families, including:

A. Up to 2 years of transitional child care benefits for a
family losing eligibility because of increased earnings; and
B. Child care on the same terms as for ASPIRE participants
for a demonstration program participant who leaves the
program to participate in an education or training program
and is again a recipient of federal Aid to Families with
Dependent Children under chapter 1053.
3767. Rules; report
The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this chapter.
The commissioner shall submit an annual report by January 15th to
the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
jurisdiction over human resources matters on developments and
progress in the implementation of the Child Assistance

Demonstration Program and the effectiveness of the program.

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	This bill establishes the Child Assistance Demonstration
