Membership. State Board of Substance Abuse The Counselors, established by Title 5, section 24 subsection 41, consists of 11 members. Nine members are appointed by the Governor. One member must be the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse or a designee. 26 One member, appointed by the Chanceller Board of Trustees of the University 28 of Maine System, must be a member of the university faculty involved in the training of substance abuse counselors. Of these 30 members, 5 members must be licensed substance counselors. Two members must be nonproviders, one of whom must be 32 a family member of a consumer of substance abuse services or a consumer of substance abuse services who has abstained from the 34 use of alcohol and other drugs for a period of at least 2 years. One member must be a public member. One member must be a representative of a regional alcohol and drug abuse council. 36 Members must represent a broad geographic distribution of the 38 State and must be from among the professional associations representative of the field. 40 Sec. 7. 32 MRSA §13852, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1991, c. 263, §2, is further amended to read: 42 44 2. Members. The board consists of 13 members, 12 of them appointed by the Governor. Each member must be a citizen of the 46 United States and a resident of this State. Eight members must be licensed counseling professionals under this chapter, 2 of whom must be professional counselors, 2 must be clinical 48 professional counselors, 2 must be marriage and family therapists 50 and 2 must be pastoral counselors. Two members must be

registered counseling professionals who are not qualified for licensure. Each counselor member must have been, for at least 5

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years immediately preceding appointment, actively engaged as a practitioner, educator or researcher. Two members must be representatives of the general public and may not be currently practicing counseling or receiving compensation for counseling services. One of the 2 public members must be a consumer of counseling services. One member, appointed by the Chanceller Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System, must be a member of the university faculty involved in the training of counselors.
