A State-Pelice <u>police</u> escort is required when the Secretary
of State issues a permit for a single vehicle or a combination of
vehicles 125 feet or more in length or 16 feet or more in width.
The Secretary of State shall require as a provision of the permit
that the vehicle be escorted by the State Pelice a police
officer. The Secretary of State, with the advice of the
Commissioner of Transportation, may require vehicles of lesser
dimensions to be escorted by the State Police a police officer.
The-Bureau-of-State-Pelice-shall-establish-a A fee must be
established by the law enforcement agency of jurisdiction to be
paid by the permittee for these State-Pelise escorts. All fees
collected pursuant to this paragraph must be used to defray the
cost of services provided.

With the advice of the Commissioner of Transportation and the Chief of the State Police, the Secretary of State shall establish rules for the operation of pilot vehicles and the requirement of State-Peliee police escorts in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill permits any police officer to escort oversized vehicles over bridges and ways.
