Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA 37463-A, sub- 493, as amended by PL 1989, c. 493, 37 and 76, is further amended to read:

4. Hunting permits. The commissioner may issue up to 1,000 moose hunting permits annually and may establish the number of moose hunting permits to be issued for each moose hunting zone. No more than 10% of the moose hunting permits may be issued to nonresident and alien hunters. A--person-whose-application-is selected-may-purchase-a-moose-hunting-permit-upon-presentation-of preef-that-the-person-pessesses:

- 14 A.---A-valid-Maine-hunting-lieense,--if--the-person-is--a resident-of-the-State,-or
 - B.--A-valid-Maine-big-game-hunting-license,-if-the-person-is a-nonresident-or-alien.

20 The fee for a moose hunting permit is \$25 for residents and \$200 for nonresidents and aliens. While hunting moose, each 22 nonresident or alien hunter, both permittee and subpermittee, shall must be in possession of a valid Maine nonresident or alien 24 big game hunting license, whichever is applicable.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA 7463-A, sub-5, as amended by PL 1985, c. 120, 1 and 2, is further amended to read:

5. Eligibility. Except as provided in this subsection, any
Maine resident, nonresident or alien who is-eligible-to-obtain holds a Maine hunting license or Maine big game hunting license
is eligible to apply for a moose hunting permit. No A person who has obtained a moose hunting permit may not obtain another permit
until 2 5 years have elapsed since the issuance of the last permit. This limitation does not apply to subpermittees.

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 38 118, §2, is amended to read:

6. Application procedure. Eligible persons wishing to apply for a permit shall file a written application for a permit on a form furnished by the commissioner. The application must include the applicant's hunting license number. The application shall must be accompanied by an application fee of \$5 for residents and \$10 for nonresidents and aliens. The application fee may not be refunded. No <u>A</u> person may <u>not</u> file more than one application. Any <u>A</u> person who submits more than one application shall--be is disqualified from the selection of permittees.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the moose hunting laws to establish a permit system similar to the system now in use for antlerless deer permits. Under the revised system, a person must hold a valid hunting license in order to apply and must place the number of that hunting license on the permit application. The bill also amends the period a person must wait before that person may apply for a moose permit from 2 years to 5 years.
