HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 759, L.D. 1026, Bill, "An Act to Clarify the Requirements of Disclosure of Information Pertaining to Mentally Disabled Clients"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 5 in paragraph D in the 4th line from the end (page 2, line 20 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "committee" the following: 'pursuant to Title 5, section 12002, subsection 1, paragraph A' and in the 3rd line from the end (page 2, line 21 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "rules." the following: 'The members of the advisory committee are not entitled to reimbursement for expenses or legislative per diem.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment clarifies the appointment procedure by which the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation appoints the members of the advisory committee.

It also adds language that indicates that the members of the advisory committee are not entitled to reimbursement of expenses or legislative per diem.
