HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 345,
L.D. 1040, Bill, "An Act to Provide Consistency in the Animal
Welfare Laws"

Amend the amendment on page 3 in paragraph A in the first
paragraph by striking out all of the last 2 sentences (page 3,
lines 14 to 17 in amendment).

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the
fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The replacement of lost dog tags will result in
insignificant increases of dedicated revenues to the Department
of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources from replacement fees
for lost dog tags.

The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources will
incur some minor additional costs to provide animal control
shelters with temporary license forms. These costs can be
absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated
with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system
can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
Department. The collection of additional fines may increase
General Fund revenues by a minor amount.'
