

Committees.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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4       Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1017-A, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c.  
839, §23 and affected by §33, is amended to read:

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8       1. Contributions. A party committee shall report all  
contributions in cash or in kind from an individual contributor  
10 that in the aggregate in a campaign total \$250--~~or~~ more than  
12 \$200. The party committee shall report the name, mailing  
address, occupation and place of business of each contributor.  
Contributions of less than \$250 \$200 must be reported, and these  
contributions may be reported as a lump sum.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

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20       This bill makes the state threshold for reporting itemized  
contributions for state party committees consistent with federal  
requirements.
