	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§9, as repealed and replaced by PL
4	1991, c. 29, is repealed.
6	Sec.2. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§9-A is enacted to read:
8	<u>9-A. Pemalty. Notwithstanding Title 17-A, section 4-B:</u>
10	A. A person who takes or possesses shellfish in violation of a municipal ordinance adopted under this section commits
12	<u>a crime punishable by:</u>
14	(1) For the first offense, a fine not less than \$100 and not more than \$1,000; and
16	(2) For subsequent offenses, a fine not less than \$500
18	and not more than \$1,000. The court may not suspend a fine imposed under this subparagraph; and

22	<u>B. Notwithstanding paragraph A, the fine for taking shellfish from a closed area or for digging shellfish without a license may not be less than \$500 and not more</u>
24	\$1,500. The court may not suspend a fine imposed under this paragraph.

28	<u>A fine for a violation of article 5 must be as provided by section 6681.</u>

	This bill changes the penalty provisions applicable to
34	violations of municipal shellfish-harvesting ordinances by increasing the minimum fine for subsequent offenses from \$100 to
36	\$500 and prohibiting the court from suspending the fine for subsequent offenses.
