Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§§1 to 3, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 465, §3, are amended to read:

1. Licensed professional counselor. To be qualified as a licensed professional counselor, an applicant shall----have demenstrated <u>must</u> demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the counseling profession, shall-have <u>must</u> successfully completed <u>complete</u> the examination prescribed by the board and shall <u>must</u> have received:

A. A master's degree in counseling or an allied mental health field from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Such schooling shall-have-included <u>must include</u> a minimum core curriculum as adopted by the board; and

B. Two years of experience after-obtainment-of-a-master's degree with a minimum of 2,000 hours of supervised experience.

An applicant who has completed a master's degree in counseling, 42 as required by paragraph A, may apply 1/2 of the internship hours completed as part of this degree, to a maximum of 300 hours, 44 toward the supervised experience requirement of 2,000 hours.

2. Licensed clinical professional counselor. To be qualified as a licensed clinical professional counselor, an applicant shall--have--demonstrated must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the counseling profession, shall--have must successfully completed complete the examination prescribed by the board and shall must have received: 4

A. A master's degree in counseling or an allied mental health field from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Such schooling shall must include a minimum core curriculum, as adopted by the board, of at least 45 semester hours; and

B. Two years of experience after-obtainment-of-a-master's degree, to include at least 3,000 hours of supervised clinical experience with a minimum of 100 hours of personal supervision.

20 An applicant who has completed a master's degree in counseling, as required by paragraph A, may apply 1/2 of the internship hours 22 completed as part of this degree, to a maximum of 600 hours, toward the supervised clinical experience requirement of 3,000 24 hours.

3. Licensed marriage and family therapist. To be qualified as a licensed marriage and family therapist, an applicant shall have--demonstrated <u>must demonstrate</u> to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the counseling profession, shall have <u>must</u> successfully completed <u>complete</u> the examination prescribed by the board and shall <u>must</u> have received:

A. A master's degree in marriage and family therapy or its equivalent from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Such schooling shall-have-included <u>must include</u> a minimum core curriculum to include a one-year clinical practicum adopted by the board; and

B. Two years of experience after-obtainment-of-a-master's degree comprised of at least 1,000 hours of direct clinical contact with couples and families and 200 hours of supervision, at least 100 of which shall <u>must</u> be individual supervision.

An applicant who has completed a master's degree in marriage and family therapy, as required by paragraph A, may apply 1/2 of the internship hours completed as part of this degree, to a maximum of 200 hours, toward the requirement of 1,000 hours of direct clinical contact with couples and families.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§3-A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 263, §3, is further amended to read:

3-A. Licensed pastoral counselor. To be qualified as a licensed pastoral counselor, an applicant must have:

A. Demenstrated <u>Demonstrate</u> to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the standard ethics of the pastoral counseling profession;

B. Received <u>Have</u> a Master of Divinity degree, or an equivalent degree approved by the board, from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Academic preparation includes a minimum graduate core curriculum to include 20 credit hours of counseling and human relations and 400 hours of clinical pastoral education;

- C. Two <u>Have 2</u> years of experience after-attainment-of-the degree, comprised of at least 1,000 hours of direct clinical contact with individuals, couples and families;
- D. Two-hundred <u>Have 200</u> hours of supervision, including at least 1/3 of those hours with a certified pastoral counseling supervisor, at least 30 hours of which must be interdisciplinary, 30 hours of which must be individual supervision by one supervisor of no more than 3 cases from intake to termination, and 70 hours of which must be individual supervision of multiple case material;
- 30 E. A <u>Have a</u> call, appointment or charge by a church, synagogue, religious order or other clearly defined legal
 32 religious organization to perform these services as a function of ministry; and
 - F. Completed <u>Complete</u> successfully the examination prescribed by the board pursuant to subsection 5.
- An applicant who has completed a Master of Divinity degree, as required by paragraph B, may apply 1/2 of the internship hours
 completed as part of this degree, to a maximum of 200 hours, toward the requirement of 1,000 hours of direct clinical contact
 with individuals, couples and families.
 - Sec. 3. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue to carry out the purposes of this Act.

40	be after the master's degree. This amendment allows 1/2 of the internship hours received while obtaining the master's degree to
42	be applied toward the experience requirement.
