'Sec. 3. Expenditures in excess of allocations. Expenditures
required by this Act from funds other than the General Fund or the Highway Fund are authorized to exceed legislative allocations
for fiscal year 1994-95. Appropriate adjustments to basic work programs facilitating these expenditures in excess of allocations
must be recommended by the State Budget Officer and approved by the Governor.

General Fund Highway Fund

\$84,430 31,680

Expanding the pool of counseling professionals that are recognized by insurers as service providers will increase the cost of the State's employee health insurance program by approximately \$177,000 annually. In fiscal year 1994-95 a General Fund appropriation of \$84,430 and a Highway Fund allocation of \$31,680 will be required for the additional premium costs. The remaining annual costs of \$60,890 will be shared by accounts in other funds, which may require increased allotments.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds an unallocated section, an appropriation section, an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill. This amendment also conforms existing law to current drafting standards.
