

An Act Repealing Advisory Boards on Marine Resources Matters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§58, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
786, §5, is repealed.

8 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6462, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B,
§63, is repealed.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill repeals the Lobster Advisory Council.

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16 This bill is submitted in compliance with Public Law 1991,
chapter 844, section 8, which requires the Secretary of State to
submit legislation repealing all advisory boards and commissions
18 listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 12004-I
and 12004-J as well as other advisory boards and commissions with
similar functions.

22 Pursuant to that law, the boards and commissions have been
grouped by the subject areas within the jurisdiction of each
joint standing committee and each special select committee. This
24 bill repeals certain boards and commissions identified within the
jurisdiction of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources.
