

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STATEMENT OF FACT

8 This resolve continues the Commission to Study the
10 Feasibility of a Capital Cultural Center by requiring an
additional report from the commission by November 1, 1994. The
12 resolve authorizes the formation of an advisory committee and the
hiring of a consultant. Funds appropriated from the General Fund
14 are contingent upon receipt by the commission of funds from the
City of Augusta and the University of Maine System.
