	1. Board authorized to act as commission. If a
8	consumer-owned electric utility is governed by a board composed
	of at least 3 members who are elected by the customers or voters
10	within its service area, that board may, at its option, exercise
	the powers of the commission under this Title and any other
12	provision of law. A decision to exercise the commission's power
	and authority must be for whole calendar years.

	2. Payment of assessment not required. For any calendar
16	year in which the board of a consumer-owned electric utility
	exercises the option described in subsection 1, the utility is
18	not required to pay the assessment for the support of the
	commission or of the Public Advocate as prescribed in this Title.

	3. Rules. The board of any consumer-owned electric utility
22	may adopt the rules adopted by the commission with respect to
	electric utilities or any part of those rules as part of its own
24	terms and conditions of service.
