## An Act to Facilitate the Procurement of License Plates for County-owned Vehicles.

#### Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §256, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

1-A. County vehicles. All county-owned vehicles must be б registered with the Secretary of State and must meet the inspection requirement of section 2502 but are exempt from this 8 Title as to registration fees. A plate for a county-owned law enforcement vehicle must be either a 10-year semipermanent plate 10 designed with a brown background and white lettering and containing lettering or insignias designating the plate as a 12 sheriff's plate and the county for which the vehicle is owned, or the standard plate issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles 14 pursuant to section 131. Plates for any county-owned vehicle not used in law enforcement must be of a design determined by the 16 Secretary of State but may not be similar to the county-owned law enforcement plates. At the discretion of the sheriff, the record 18 of the registration of any county-owned vehicle displaying a standard registration plate issued by the Bureau of Motor 20 Vehicles may be designated and held confidential, All registrations for county-owned vehicles displaying semipermanent 22 or confidential plates must be obtained at the main office of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. The registration of any county-owned 24 vehicle for all other standard plates issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles may be obtained from any office of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. 26

Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §256, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 855, is further amended to read:

Ζ. Municipal vehicles. All county, municipal, school and 32 water district vehicles shall must be registered with the Secretary of State who shall furnish semipermanent plates for . 34 each vehicle which-shall that expire at the end of each 10-year semipermanent plate program. The vehicles shall-be are exempt from this Title as to payment-of registration fees, but shall are 36 not be exempt from the inspection requirements of section 2502. 38 The plate or plates shall must be of a design determined by the Secretary of State. At the discretion of the sheriff, the record 40 of the registration of any vehicle under this subsection displaying a standard registration plate issued by the Bureau of 42 Motor Vehicles may be designated and held confidential.

- 44 Municipal vehicles used by full-time law enforcement departments may be issued special police plates at the request of the chief
  46 law enforcement official of that municipality. The plates may only be attached to municipally owned vehicles.
- A municipal fire department or an organized volunteer fire 50 department may-be <u>is</u> exempt from this Title as to registration

and payment of registration fees, but shall <u>is</u> not be exempt from the inspection requirements of section 2502.

4 All vehicles owned or used by any municipal corporation and all vehicles loaned by automobile dealers to municipalities for law enforcement agencies to use for educational purposes, or for use 6 in driver education in secondary schools and all motor vehicles loaned by automobile dealers to private secondary schools for use 8 in driver education in the schools, vehicles loaned to state universities used in organized programs and all motor vehicles 10 used in volunteer ambulance and rescue squad services in such municipalities shall must be registered, but shall-be are exempt 12 from this Title as to the registration fees, except that when the vehicles are leased or rented for commercial purposes they shall 14 be are subject to payment-of fees as provided in this Title. All such vehicles shall <u>must</u> display registration plates as required 16 by this Title or approved by the Secretary of State.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill permits procurement of motor vehicle registration plates at places other than the Bureau of Motor Vehicles' office in Augusta and establishes standards for county vehicles.
