

An Act Repealing Advisory Boards on Corrections Matters.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

808, §1, is repealed.

8 Sec. A-2. 34-A MRSA §1204-A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 314,
10 §14, is repealed.

12 PART B

14 Sec. B-1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
786, §5, is repealed.

16 Sec. B-2. 34-A MRSA §3002, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt.
18 B, §159, is repealed.

20 PART C

22 Sec. C-1. 5 MRSA §3358, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 417, §1, is
repealed.

24 Sec. C-2. 5 MRSA §12004-J, sub-§10, as enacted by PL 1991, c.
26 417, §2, is repealed.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

30 Part A repeals the Maine Correctional Advisory Commission.

32 Part B repeals the Board of Visitors for institutions under
34 the Department of Corrections, including these specific boards:
Board of Visitors, Maine Youth Center; Board of Visitors, Maine
36 Correctional Center; and Board of Visitors, Maine State Prison.

38 Part C repeals the Maine Criminal Justice Commission.

40 This bill is submitted in compliance with Public Law 1991,
chapter 844, section 8, which requires the Secretary of State to
42 submit legislation repealing all advisory boards and commissions
44 listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 12004-I
and 12004-J as well as other advisory boards and commissions with
similar functions.

46 Pursuant to that law, the boards and commissions have been
48 grouped by the subject areas within the jurisdiction of each
joint standing committee and each special select committee. This
50 bill repeals certain boards and commissions identified within the
jurisdiction of the Joint Select Committee on Corrections.
