	9. Economic analysis. For rules adopted by the Department
б	of Environmental Protection, the Department of Economic and
	Community Development shall prepare an economic analysis, at
8	<u>least 15 days before the scheduled public hearing, for each</u>
	proposed rule.

	A. The economic analysis must contain:

	(1) An estimate of the total direct economic costs
14	accruing to businesses in the State if the proposed
	rule is adopted;

	(2) An estimate of the total direct economic costs
18	accruing to municipalities in the State if the proposed
	rule is adopted;

	(3) An estimate of the average direct economic costs
22	accruing to a small business if the proposed rule is
	adopted; and

	(4) An estimate of the average direct economic costs
26	accruing to a municipality of 2,000 inhabitants if the
	proposed rule is adopted.

	B. The Department of Environmental Protection shall provide
30	the Department of Economic and Community Development copies
	of each proposed rule at the same time the rule is posted
32	for public hearing.
34	C. The Department of Economic and Community Development
	shall prepare its economic analysis by drawing upon
36	information provided by the Department of Environmental
	Protection, information provided by businesses and

	nationally available data bases.

	D. The Department of Economic and Community Development
42	shall make the economic analysis required by this subsection
	<u>public and available upon request to any party at least 15</u>

	As used in this subsection, "small business" has the same meaning
48	as in subsection 5-A and "direct economic cost" means total
	expenditures, over the lifetime of an investment, equivalent to

all capital operating expenditures.
