## An Act to Increase Access to Primary Care by Redefining the Practice of Advanced Nursing.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2101, as amended by PL 1985, c. 724, §1, is further amended to read:

6 **§2101.** Purpose

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8 In order to safeguard the life and health of the people in this State, any person who for compensation practices or offers 10 to practice professional nursing, advanced professional nursing or practical nursing in this State shall-hereafter-be-required-te 12 must submit evidence that he-er-she the person is qualified se to practice, and shall <u>must</u> be licensed <u>and approved</u> as provided. 14 It shall-be is unlawful for any person not licensed under this chapter to practice or to offer to practice professional, 16 advanced professional or practical nursing in this State; or to use any sign, card or device or in any way hold oneself out to the public to indicate that such the person is a professional 18 registered nurse, nurse in advanced practice or a licensed 20 practical nurse.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA  $\S2102$ , sub-\$2,  $\PA$ , as amended by PL 1991, c. 731, \$1, is further amended to read:

A. Diagnosis and treatment of human responses to actual or potential physical and emotional health problems, through such services as case finding, health teaching, health counseling and provision of care supportive to or restorative of life and well-being and execution of the medical regimen as prescribed by a licensed physician, nurse in advanced practice, podiatrist or dentist or otherwise legally authorized person acting under thedelegated authority of a physician, nurse in advanced practice, podiatrist or dentist:

(1) "Diagnosis" in the context of nursing practice means that identification of and discrimination between physical and psychosocial signs and symptoms essential to effective execution and management of the nursing regimen. This diagnostic privilege is distinct from medical diagnosis;

(2) "Human responses" means those signs, symptoms and
 44 processes that denote the individual's health needs or reaction to an actual or potential health problem; and

(3) "Treatment" means selection and performance of
 those therapeutic measures essential to the effective management and execution of the nursing regimen;

F. Unprefessional Engaging in unprofessional conduct. A licensee shall-be-deemed is determined to have engaged in unprofessional conduct if he <u>that licensee</u> violates any standard of professional behavior which <u>that</u> has been established in the practice for which the licensee is licensed <u>or approved</u>;

G. One of the nurse members of 30 the board must be a nurse who is currently practicing long-term 32 care nursing. 8 §2201-A. Advanced practice qualifications

10 <u>A professional nurse applying for approval to practice as a nurse in advanced practice must submit to the board written</u>
12 <u>evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant:</u>

14 **1. Current license.** Holds a current license to practice as a professional nurse in the State;

2. Advanced education. Has completed an advanced education 18 program in the area of specialty; and

3. National certification. Has been certified to practice
 specialized and advanced nursing by a national certifying
 association approved by the board.

Sec. 10. 32 MRSA §2206, as amended by PL 1991, c. 153, §2, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

42 The approval of a nurse in advanced practice under this chapter is renewable at the time of that nurse's application for 44 renewal of that nurse's license to practice professional nursing. The renewal application must include written evidence, 46 verified by oath, that the nurse in advanced practice is currently certified in the nurse's area of specialty. 48

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to improve access to the health 4 care delivery system in the State by promoting effective utilization of nurses in advanced practice.

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This bill clarifies the eligibility requirements and the approval process for persons who practice advanced professional nursing.

This bill also requires that one member of the State Board 12 of Nursing be a nurse in advanced practice.

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
