COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 875, L.D. 1189, Bill, "An Act to Establish a State Trauma Care System"

Amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "§87-A." in subsection 1 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 48 in L.D.) by striking out the following: ", coordinate and monitor" and in the 3rd line (page 1, line 49 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and develop a trauma care system"

Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "§87-A." by striking out all of subsections 3 to 6.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 5. Report. By January 1, 1994, Maine Emergency Medical Services shall submit to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources the plan developed in accordance with this Act, along with any legislation necessary to implement the trauma care system envisioned by the plan.

FISCAL NOTE

The additional costs to develop a plan for a statewide trauma care system and report to the Legislature by January 1, 1994 can be absorbed by the Maine Emergency Medical Services Program within the Department of Public Safety utilizing existing federal funds.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 875, L.D. 1189

STATEMENT OF FACT

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The original bill required Maine Emergency Medical Services to develop and implement a plan for a trauma care system in the State. This amendment requires only the plan to be developed and directs Maine Emergency Management Services to submit the plan and implementing legislation to the Legislature by January 1, 1994.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
