

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3907, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 383,
§3, is amended to read:

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill redefines the term "at large" to include a dog that is not leashed. Dogs participating in dog shows or exhibitions, field trials or hunting are not considered "at large."
