An Act to Provide Fair and Equitable Access to Marine Shellfish.

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6671, sub-§3-A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 831, §1, is further amended to read:

3-A. Shellfish conservation license; qualifications, fees, procedures. A shellfish conservation ordinance may fix the qualifications for a license, including-municipal--residency, subject to the following provisions.

 A. No  $\underline{A}$  municipal commercial license may <u>not</u> be issued unless the applicant has a current shellfish license, as provided in section 6601. A municipality may issue licenses under this section regardless of whether or not the area has been closed by the commissioner. A person taking shellfish from a closed area for depuration under a depuration certificate issued by the commissioner is not required to hold a municipal shellfish license.

B. A shellfish conservation ordinance may fix license fees. The-fee-fer-a-resident-license-may-net-exceed-\$200 and-the-fee-fer-a-nonresident-license-may-be-not-more-than twice-the-resident-fee-

C. Application methods and procedures for licenses may be determined by the shellfish conservation ordinance subject to the provisions of this section. Notice of the number and the procedure for application shall must be published in a trade or industry publication or in a newspaper or combination of newspapers with general circulation which that the municipal officers consider effective in reaching persons affected not less than 10 days prior to the period of issuance and shall must be posted in the municipal offices until the period concludes.
