An Act Concerning Certain Counseling Services.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §§3819-A and 3820 are enacted to read:

§3819-A. Sliding scale required

A person licensed under this chapter must offer a sliding scale of fees for services for private clients based on a client's income. The State Board of Examiners of Psychologists may establish by rule standards for meeting this requirement.

12 §3820. Withholding information

14A person licensed under this chapter may not withhold
information from another counselor, social worker, psychologist,16psychiatrist or state agency on a client who is on probation,
regardless of whether or not that client has paid for services18provided by the licensee. For purposes of this section,
"probation" means a procedure under which a person found guilty20of an offense is released by the court, without being committed
to a correctional facility or with or without commitment to jail22or fine, subject to conditions imposed by the court.

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Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3835, last ¶ is enacted to read:

26 Every renewal is contingent on a showing that the applicant has provided at least 50 hours of service annually on a pro bono

The applicant also must present evidence that the applicant has provided at least 50 hours of service annually on a pro bono basis. The board may establish by rule standards for meeting this requirement.

Sec. 5. 32 MRSA §§7006 and 7007 are enacted to read:

§7006. Withholding information

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A person licensed under this chapter may not withhold information from another counselor, social worker, psychologist, psychiatrist or state agency on a client who is on probation, regardless of whether or not that client has paid for services provided by the licensee. For purposes of this section, "probation" means a procedure under which a person found guilty of an offense is released by the court, without being committed to a correctional facility or with or without commitment to jail or fine, subject to conditions imposed by the court.

<u>§7007. Sliding scale required</u>

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A person licensed under this chapter must offer a sliding scale of fees for services for private clients based on a client's income. The board may establish by rule standards for meeting this requirement.

Sec. 6. 32 MRSA §7060, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §122, is amended to read:

Licenses shall expire biennially on December 31st or at such other times as the Commissioner of Professional and Financial 32 Regulation may designate. Biennial fees for renewal of license shall must be set by the board in an amount not to exceed those 34 amounts specified in section 7056 and shall--be are due and payable biennially on or before the first day of January. 36 License renewal fees for certified social workers shall-be are 38 the same as those for licensed master social workers. Every 2nd renewal shall-be is contingent upon evidence of participation in 40 a continuing professional education course or program as approved by the board. Every renewal is contingent upon a showing that the applicant has provided at least 50 hours of service annually 42 on a pro bono basis. The board may establish by rule standards for meeting this requirement. A license may be renewed up to 90 44 days after the date of expiration upon payment of a late fee of 46 \$10 in addition to the renewal fee. Any person who submits an application for renewal more than 90 days after the renewal date shall-be is subject to all requirements governing new applicants 48 under this chapter, except that the board may in its discretion, 50 giving due consideration to the protection of the public, waive examination if the renewal application is made within 2 years 52 from the date of the expiration.

 18 <u>A person licensed under this chapter must offer a sliding</u> scale of fees for services for private clients based on a

Sec. 8. 32 MRSA §13860, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

 3. Pro bono services. Applicants for license renewal must
 show evidence of having provided at least 50 hours of service annually on a pro bono basis. The board may establish by rule
 standards for meeting this requirement.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill applies to substance abuse counselors, licensed social workers, counseling professionals and psychologists, and requires them to provide at least 50 hours of service annually on a pro bono basis in order to renew their licenses and to provide services for private clients on a sliding scale of fees based on a client's income.

This bill provides that a licensee may not withhold information from another counselor or state agency on a client
that is on probation, regardless of whether the counselor's services have been paid for.

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
