Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7406, sub-§21 is enacted to read:

21. Hunting without guide. A person commits the offense of hunting without a guide if that person:

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that nonresidents must be accompanied by a licensed guide while hunting. Violation of this requirement is a Class E crime.
