An Act Concerning Concealed Weapon Permits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4		1. 25 MRSA §2003, sub-§1, ¶E, as amended by PL 1991, c. is further amended to read:
6	E.	Does the following:

- (1) At the request of the issuing authority, takes whatever action is required by law to allow the issuing authority to obtain from the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, limited to records of patient committals to Augusta Mental Health Institute and Bangor Mental Health Institute, the courts, law enforcement agencies and the military information relevant to the following:
 - (a) The ascertainment of whether the information supplied on the application or any documents made a part of the application is true and correct;
 - (b) The ascertainment of whether each of the additional requirements of this section has been met; and

(c) Section 2005;

(2) If a photograph is an integral part of the permit to carry concealed firearms adopted by an issuing authority, submits to being photographed for that purpose;

- (3) If it becomes necessary to resolve any questions as to identity, submits to having fingerprints taken by the issuing authority;
- Submits an application fee of \$35 for an original application, \$10 of which must be retained by the municipality and \$25 of which must be paid over by the municipality to the Treasurer of State, and \$20 for a renewal, \$5 of which must be retained by the municipality and \$15 of which must be paid over by the municipality to the Treasurer of State, for a resident of the State. A person who paid \$60 for a concealed weapons permit or renewal during 1991 or 1992 is entitled to a credit toward renewal fees in an amount equal to \$30 for a person who paid \$60 for an original application and \$45 for a person who paid \$60 for a permit renewal. The credit is valid until fully utilized. A person 55 years of age or older, upon application to the Treasurer of State, is authorized to receive a full refund instead of a credit toward The fee covers both the cost renewal fees. processing the

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2	application by the issuing authority and the cost o the permit to carry concealed firearms issued by the issuing authority; and

6	(5) Demonstrates to the issuing authority a knowledge of handgun safety. The applicant may fully satisfy
8	this requirement by submitting to the issuing authority, through documentation in accordance with this subparagraph, proof that the applicant has within
10	5 years prior to the date of application completed a course that included handgun safety offered by or under
12	the supervision of a federal, state, county or municipal law enforcement agency or a firearms
14	instructor certified by a private firearms association recognized as knowledgeable in matters of firearms
16	safety by the issuing authority or by the state in which the course was taken. A course completion
18	certificate or other document, or a photocopy, is sufficient if it recites or otherwise demonstrates that
20	the course meets all of the requirements of this subparagraph.
22	As an alternative way of fully satisfying this
24	requirement, an applicant may personally demonstrate knowledge of handgun safety to an issuing authority, if
26	the issuing authority is willing to evaluate an applicant's personal demonstration of such knowledge.
28	The issuing authority is not required to offer this 2nd option.
30	: The demonstration of knowledge of handgun safety to the
32	issuing authority may not be required of any applicant who holds a valid State <u>state</u> permit to carry a
34	concealed firearm as of April 15, 1990 or of any applicant who was or is in any of the Armed Forces of
36	the United States and has received at least basic firearms training.
38	Sec. 2. Refund of concealed weapon fee. Upon application to the
40	Treasurer of State, the Treasurer of State is authorized to refund a person 55 years of age or older for the amount
42	authorized to be credited to that person toward concealed weapons renewals under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section
44	2003, subsection 1, paragraph E, subparagraph 4.

50	This bill authorizes a full refund to a person 55 years of age or older for overpayment of fees for concealed weapons permits and renewals during 1991 and 1992.
