Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

- Whereas, injuries are the 5th leading cause of death in Maine and the leading cause of death for residents under 35 years of age; and
- Whereas, suicide and homicide represent about 1/3 of total injury deaths; and 10

Whereas, during 1989 and 1990 in Maine, male assaults on females accounted for 75% of the total number of assaults and 14 another 6% were assaults on children by parents; and

Whereas, during 1989, of 2,257 children 16 who were substantiated victims of abuse, 48 had major physical injuries and 541 had minor physical injuries; and 18

Whereas, it is known that children growing up in violent 20 families may exhibit aggressive, disruptive behavior with siblings and schoolmates, delinquency and violence; and 22

24 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 26 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 28 safety; now; therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Study to identify extent of violence among children. 30 Resolved: That the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health, Division of Maternal and Child Health shall study 32 available data to identify the extent of the problem of violence among children, teens and young adults in the State. In addition 34 to identifying the problem, the study must assess the need for further steps, including any legislation necessary, and make 36 recommendations that would reduce the incidence and impact of violence among those at highest risk in a report to the Joint 38 Standing Committee on Human Resources and the Executive Director of the Legislative Council by November 1, 1993. 40

- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 42 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
