Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17751, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1991, c. 878, \$1, is further amended to read:

The

Except as provided in

subsection 3-A, the board shall determine by appropriate rules how much service in any year qualifies for one year's service 10 12 14 16 18 20 22

credit. Service rendered for the full normal working time in any year qualifies for one year's service credit. The board shall provide in its rule related to the determination of creditable service for state employees that any part-time or seasonal state employee who was employed during the period beginning January 1, 1989 and ending June 30, 1991 is credited with a full year of creditable service for each year in which that employee is employed for 1,000 or more hours, for as long as that employee is employed by the State. The board's rule must also treat in the same manner any employee first employed before July 1, 1991 who is employed in a position that is in a career ladder in which the employee is required to move from full-time status to seasonal status when accepting a promotion in the employee's career

Section 17001, subsection 13, paragraph E does not apply to an employee who is credited with a full year of creditable service under this provision. Each state department or agency

shall submit to the retirement system a list of all employees to whom this provision applies, in the manner and time provided by board rule.
