HOUSE AMENDMENT

HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1005, L.D. 1351

The Bureau of Motor Vehicles will receive additional dedicated funds from the Department of Environmental Protection to offset these Highway Fund costs. The Department of Environmental Protection has adequate dedicated revenues to cover this transfer of funds.

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The Department of Environmental Protection may incur some minor additional costs to adopt certain rules relating to the motor vehicle emission standards program. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

Exempting certain motor vehicles from testing requirements and eliminating the licensing of fleet emission inspection stations will result in insignificant reductions of dedicated revenues to the Department of Environmental Protection.

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This bill also establishes a new civil violation. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenues by minor amounts.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment ensures that the Highway Fund will be reimbursed by the Department of Environmental Protection for costs associated with enforcement of the emissions standards as it relates to registration denial or suspension.

This amendment also replaces the fiscal note on the committee amendment.
