A court may not order a restraint on the public dissemination of information concerning matters of public health or safety obtained or used during trial or pretrial discovery proceedings in a lawsuit based on a claim of product liability. Information includes, but is not limited to, evidence of other similar injuries, illnesses or legal claims; records of research findings documenting potential public health hazards; internal company documents concerning potential public health hazards; and records filed with a governmental agency. A contract, agreement or judicial order limiting public access to information concerning matters of public health or safety is void and unenforceable.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits courts from ordering the restraint of information relating to the public health or safety used or obtained in a lawsuit based on a claim of product liability.
